

Anil Rupasingha, New Mexico State University

Anil Rupasingha is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Agricultural Economics and Agricultural Business and Community and Economic Development Specialist with the Cooperative Extension Service at New Mexico State University (NMSU). Before joining NMSU, he has been an Assistant Professor of Economics at American University of Sharjah in the U.A.E., a Senior Research Associate in the Northeast Regional Center for Rural Development at Penn State University, and a Postdoctoral Scholar in the TVA Rural Studies at the University of Kentucky. He holds a Ph.D. degree in Agricultural Economics from Texas A&M University, and an undergraduate degree in Economics from the University of Peradeniya in Sri Lanka.

Dr. Rupasingha has published research on various economic and community development issues such as economic growth, methods and analysis of community development, entrepreneurship and industrial location, effects and determinants of social capital, returns to human capital, poverty, welfare, migration, and environmental quality. Recent studies include investigating effects of agricultural value-added industries, effects and determinants of self-employment, rural income convergence, and religion and economic growth. Current studies include investigating determinants and effects of microenterprises in the rural areas of the U.S., reasons for recent metro to nonmetro migration in the U.S., determinants of child poverty, and social divergence and provision of public goods.

Dr. Rupasingha has an active state-wide extension program in rural community and economic development and has teaching responsibilities with the newly implemented Doctorate of Economic Development program at NMSU.
