



Tenth District Manufacturing Activity Continued at a Strong Pace

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – The Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City released the [August Manufacturing Survey](#) today. According to Chad Wilkerson, vice president and economist at the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City, the survey revealed that Tenth District manufacturing activity continued at a strong pace, and expectations for future activity remained solid.

“Regional factory activity growth remained positive in August,” said Wilkerson. “Manufacturing finished goods prices rose at a record pace. Firms reported solid expectations for future production overall, but 20% of firms reported a recent decrease in activity due to the recent surge in COVID-19 cases.” Historical data, results from past surveys and release dates for future surveys can be found at <https://kansascityfed.org/surveys/manufacturing-survey/>.
