



Tenth District Manufacturing Activity Continued to Decelerate

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – The Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City released the [September Manufacturing Survey](#) today.

According to Chad Wilkerson, vice president and economist at the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City, the survey revealed that Tenth District manufacturing activity continued to decelerate, while prices rose further.

“Regional factory activity was sluggish overall in September,” said Wilkerson. “However, firms continued to add workers and were moderately optimistic about growth in future months.”
