



Tenth District Manufacturing Activity Declined at a Slightly Faster Pace

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – The Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City released the [December Manufacturing Survey](#) today.

According to Chad Wilkerson, senior vice president at the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City, the survey revealed that Tenth District manufacturing activity declined at a faster pace than last month, while expectations for future activity were mostly flat or slightly positive.

“Regional factory activity declined at a slightly faster pace in December than the previous month,” said Wilkerson. “The index for raw materials prices also fell to its lowest level since July 2020.”
