



Tenth District Manufacturing Activity Declined Somewhat in September

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – The Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City released the [September Manufacturing Survey](#) today.

According to Chad Wilkerson, senior vice president at the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City, the survey revealed that Tenth District manufacturing activity declined somewhat in September, and expectations for future activity stayed mostly flat.

“Regional factory activity declined somewhat in September,” said Wilkerson. “District production decreased while employment stayed steady, and access to credit has remained unchanged for a strong majority of manufacturing firms.”
