Christopher Delgado is economics and policy adviser in the Agriculture and Environmental Services Department at the World Bank, and leads the Department's Agricultural and Environmental Economics and Policy Practice. He was the founding program manager of both the Bank's Global Food Crisis Response Program (GFRP) and the G20-requested Global Agricultural and Food Security Program (GAFSP) that is under external governance. He was the World Bank focal point for food security issues in the Korean and French G20 Presidencies, and is assisting with this under the Mexican and Russian G20 Presidencies. He holds a Ph.D. in economics from Cornell University. A former United States Peace Corps Volunteer (Chad), university researcher (University of Michigan), and part-time teacher (Johns Hopkins Nitze School of Advanced International Studies), he came to the Bank in 2006 from 26 years at the International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI) and the International Livestock Research Institute (ILRI). He has lived and worked widely in Europe, Africa, and Asia, and has published extensively in a number of languages.
