When you put together words that have the same beginning letter or sound, it is called alliteration. An example of alliteration is Financial Fables, with both words starting with the letter “F.”

PART 1 DIRECTIONS: Read through “Shopping Wisely with Olivia Owl” again to find more examples of alliteration. List three of your examples below.

Possible Answers: Rhoda Roadrunner, clickety-clacked, Frequent Flyer, Olivia Owl, Meal-in-a-Minute

PART 2 DIRECTIONS: A tongue twister is a sentence where almost all of the words begin with the same letter. Use one of your examples from above to create a tongue twister sentence using other words with the same letter. An example might be: **Meal-in-a-Minute Market makes money selling marvelous milk.**
