UNIQUE ORIGAMI EXHIBIT NOW ON DISPLAY AT THE MONEY MUSEUM

KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI — The Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City invites the public to visit “Into the Fold: U.S. Currency Origami,” now on display for a limited time at the Money Museum.

This collection, created by Chicago artist Steve Robbins, features more than two dozen geometric structures made of currency, illustrating how dollars can be transformed into beautiful works of art. “Into the Fold” runs through December 31, 2019 and admission is free for all ages. The display includes infographic banners that also detail the history of origami and [videos](#) describing how the artist used multiple dollar bills to create 3-D structures inspired by Greek philosophy.

Visitors will also be invited to:

- Learn about the science behind origami design.
- View 26 unique works of origami art.
- Pose and take a photo in our “origami forest.”
- Make your own origami art.
- Participate in our origami guessing game.

Along with the origami display, visitors can see the Truman Coin Collection, view the Bank’s cash processing and vault, see \$40 million in cash, try their strength at lifting a 27-pound gold bar, and receive a free, souvenir bag of shredded money.

The Kansas City Money Museum is a free, self-guided experience located at 1 Memorial Drive across from the National WWI Museum and Memorial. Hours are 9:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, excluding Bank holidays. A government I.D. is required for visitors 18 and older. Visit kansascityfed.org for more information.
